The Midrealm Gets a New King and Queen while Rivenstarr Gets the Booty

During the day, we had a number of amusing Rapier Pirate Melees and a boat battle, we concluded the Pink Ribbon Challenge, and we had a siege engine battle with heavy armor fighters. We had a long list of combat authorizations on all of the fields including the siege engine area as our Baron, Duke Moonwulf, has been recently warranted as a Siege Engine Marshal.

While the fighters waged war on the high seas, students of the Arts and Sciences participated in classes and workshops. We had five teachers and over 8 classes and workshops this year including a 4 hour dance practice to prep for the evening dancing.

Arrr...the Sea Farers Feast. No one ever goes away hungry at a Rivenstar Feast and this year was no exception. Starting with hard tack and sardines (which was actually meant to be a joke), the food kept coming with scrumptious

- All of the lost and found items were claimed except a ring. That info will be posted on the website.
- The radios were very helpful this year. Next year, we could use them for zone heraldry - we make announcements on the radios and have several people herald the info instead of just one person running all over the site.
- We need to make larger more permanent signs for event staff parking and for other important areas of the event.
- If our main roads are still under construction next year, we will have to choose a better route to post on the web, the Pale, and on our flyers.
- We need to confirm the availability of the Girls' dorm showers to use next year. We may also need to post shower time limits and have a shower monitor.
- We had 10 merchants show up selling period wares. Their only complaint was that the bathroom facilities were too far for handicapped merchants.
- We had 5 teachers and 8 classes and workshops. There was excellent attendance at each of the classes.
- We should up the price of lunch to \$5 next year to better cover our costs. Even though we came up short for the total cost of the lunch supplies, we did provide a quality lunch for everyone at the event.
- We definitely need to number the feast tables next year to eliminate the mass confusion of seating.
- A public ingredients list for feast was missed this year. We will endeavor to have a list of basic ingredients again for next year's feast and for the website.
- The siege engine melees, heavy fighting, fencing, archery, thrown weapons were all successful. We will have to more firmly declare when authorizations begin and end as many of the activities started late due mostly to the lack of bodies at the start times.
- There were only two reportable injuries on the fencing list and both were minor injuries.
- The wackiness of feast was appreciated and well received by all who were in attendance.
- The surprise live music was a nice touch, but the event staff needs to know about things like this so that we do not have to lug around Moonwulf's large sound system needlessly.
- The Rivenstar Pirate flag was a big hit and we will look into making T-shirts of Moonwulf's design.

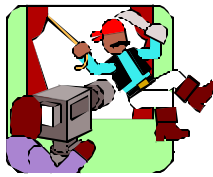
