

Friends and Fellows:

During the War Practice at 3 Saints, I heard a few of our fencers comment that certain opposing fencers were not accepting valid blows. After the Practice, one of those opponents mentioned to me in the course of a different conversation that at least one of our fencers was not accepting blows. I cannot say whether either of these complaints was valid, but as the melee season is now underway we ought to revisit the rules and conventions that keep us safe on the field. This is not a lecture, and nobody is in trouble. It's just something to think about and discuss.

On the heavy list, the conventional "wisdom" is that one must hit harder in a melee than in a tournament, especially if the opponents are strangers or foreigners. This, of course, can result in a dangerous (and illegal) escalation of force. I'm sure that I don't have to remind anyone not to do that!

Nevertheless, there are significant differences between melee and tourney fighting, and these can lead to trouble if you're not careful. In a tourney, you have time to size up your opponent before the match (reach, weapon length, armor type, etc) and to discuss questionable blows as they happen or soon after. You are also likely to know your opponent well, and I (for one) tend to fight much more cleanly against a familiar foe. Finally, in a tourney your attention is focused upon a single opponent.

In a melee, there is much more potential for confusion. You are more likely to face fighters you've never met before. You must process multiple targets/threats simultaneously. Engagements develop and change very quickly, and there is little opportunity to stop and discuss things. Honest mistakes can easily be misinterpreted as cheating, and competitiveness can escalate into aggression.

There are things that we can do to minimize these problems and make sure that our melees remain safe and fun. Awareness, of course, goes a long way. So does communication. Fatigue and frustration can creep up on a fighter, so watch your friends for signs of trouble and don't be afraid to (tactfully) remind them that, in Rivenstar, we always win our fights clean and legal.

Check your fighting garb for potential issues. Those big, fluffy sleeves might look *FAB*-ulous on the tourney lists, but if they catch somebody's point in a melee he might think that you ignored an arm hit. Armor bits that are unusually padded or rigid can cause you to fail to notice a touch altogether, so try not to over-armor yourself. Simplified, close-fitting fencing garb will help your opponent to fight you more cleanly, fairly, and safely.

Most importantly, PRACTICE. A lot. Set up a target or pell at home, and use it. Lift weights. Run laps. Eat Wheaties. Come to fighter practice, and spend your time on the field, not on the sidelines. The better you are, the more control and awareness you will have and the safer you will be. And you'll win fights. A lot of them.

My goal, both for myself as an individual fighter and for the Rivenstar unit as a whole, is to be able to pound people flat and to do it with such skill and style that they enjoy every minute of their beatings and can't wait to come back and be pounded again. It won't be easy, but it's attainable, and we can get there together. Anybody want to talk about it? You know where to find me...
