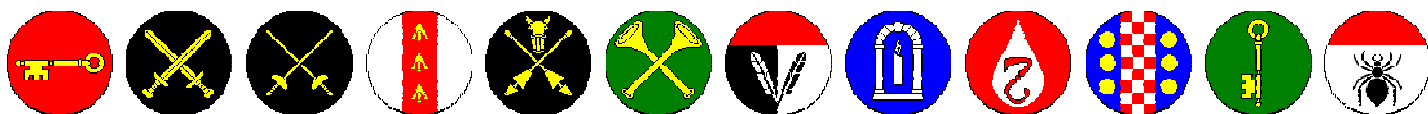

Three Saints Roundup: Pluses and minuses of the New Site and running of the Event

Minuses First—The site caretakers were aware that the porto johns were on site until Monday but not that the grill was to stay on site until Sunday afternoon instead of as planned in the morning. Some person drew on a table with a marker (probably a child) which the caretakers were able to remove. Rick had to do some extra cleaning on the stove but all the cook's are sure that nothing spilled over and that the mess on the stove was there before we arrived. One set of picnic tables didn't get put back after the dancing was over. Rick had to have help to replace them. The girl's dorm tent had 8 bent poles but worst case it might be \$80 to replace the poles if they can't be straightened. The site didn't have enough parking. Needed 3 rows instead of 2. Also need parking directors if we use this site again. Wulf was a bit put out on Sat night because there were several archers but not one person helped to put up and take down the archery butts. He also noticed that the banners and poles weren't put up or used. The hall is acoustically dead. If we use the site again, we need a sound system. Someone overheard a person say that if the feast menu had made it to the website, he or she may have stayed for the feast. We need a better web presence next time. The feast tables were too crowded. Eight people to a 6ft table was way too many; 6 people to a table or get bigger tables. Lunch was challenging in the open breeze. The grill needed a wind-break.

On the Plus Side—Rick the caretaker was impressed with how clean the field was. Attendance was good. Troll reported 200 people paid. Profit will be posted to the list. Elle said it was the best feast she ever had. Leonie comment the same (of course it was her 1st

Rivenstar feast). Lunch profit was \$96 with a great vegetarian entrée (red beans and rice). We had 6 merchants on site. Three signed up, 1 of those didn't show but 4 others did! Merchants were happy with their sales. Chirurgeon reported 2 very minor injuries. One not reported to her but heard about (just a wind break) and the other a minor cut in the kitchen. All in all a very safe event. Rocky brought archery targets and prizes which were much appreciated and welcomed. Thanks Rocky. Four items were offered at the benefit event (see article on page 1 for more detail). Dancing was well attended and went on before and after the feast. A&S classes were Period Poultry and Swine which no one attended but throughout the day, people wandered by and had discussions with Brother Johan. The children especially loved the animals. Siege Engine operation class had several attendees and one person authorized. Blackwerk class was well attended as was the felting on a bar of soap to make "washcloths". Sigulf had a half doz. people stop by for glass bead instruction throughout the day. The changing tent got a lot of use. People also used the handicap stalls. They were appreciated. Entertainment was good even though the acoustics were bad. The Madrigals and Dance numbers were planned but Denwolf was instructed by his head of house to do "something" and did a wonderful job. Wulf and John Ap Wen sang. Xenon sent a screaming monkey flying across the room to Wulf. **Now onto the Kitchen a category in itself**—The kitchen was small and needed more than one oven rack in each oven. Nearly the entire kitchen crew were also Madrigals. This was a big problem because they all cut out just as the feast was at a critical point for the 5 PM practice and even the performance itself. Thanks to Giuliana who is gifted at creating things on the spur of the moment. In comparison, this kitchen was larger than the one at the fairgrounds but that one had more ovens. Sigulf congratulated Olwen for the shelving in the beer cooler which gave us enough cooler space to handle all the food. One nice thing was that the windows overlooked the entire event site so the kitchen staff weren't so isolated. It was really good until the sun shone directly into the dish person's eyes. Another nice thing was that John Ap Wynne and Emil played and sang, entertaining the crew while they worked. Though the automatic

 A Blackwerk embroidery class and a felting class were indeed hits. People created felt around bars of soap to keep track of "washcloths" on camping trips. Sigulf demonstrated bead making to at least a half dozen people throughout the day.

For many (not least those working in the kitchen) the highlight of the entire day was the famous Rivenstar Feast. It started with a laden table followed by four equally generous courses between which tidbits to cleanse the palate were offered. All agreed that the Game Pie, Onion Tarts and Hash of Beef were outstanding. Most of the dishes contained some form of alcohol taking full advantage of the "wet" site. The cooks favored the Beef in Ale recipe especially when Jolly Red Nose Sauce was added. This sauce was in keeping with the Madrigal performance of the song by the same name and contained cinnamint, ginger, nutmeg and cloves just as in the song. The feast was interspersed with entertainment of various types. The Madrigals also sang "We Be Soldiers Three" and "God Bless the Human Elbow" with a crescendo in the chorus to raise the roof. Inspiring! Baron Moonwulf performed his new song about Blackbeard. The Rivenstar Dancers performed their prizewinning dance of The Rivenstar. Of course Russian Crème with Strawberries ended the meal and though served a little differently than usual, was still wonderful.

The entire evening was capped off by general dancing in the outdoor pavilion. Everyone went home happy, full and tired.

Some Recipes from Three Saints and a Hare (of the Dog)

**Daryoles
(Honey Quiche)**

Pie Shells	2 each
Milk	1 1/2 cups
Honey	1/4 cup
Eggs	3 each
White Wine	1/2 cup
Sugar	1/4 cup
Cinnamon	1/2 tsp.
Rosewater	1/2 tsp.

Prebake pricked pie shells, cool. Dissolve warmed honey in the wine, let cool. Whisk eggs until light and lemony colored. Whisk in milk, sugar, cinnamon and rosewater. Fill pie shells and bake at 325—350 degrees until a silver knife comes out clean when inderted half way to the middle of the pie. Cool to room temperature or chill before serving.

Onion Tarts

Sweet Onions, diced	2 cups
Butter	2 Tbl.
Eggs	2 each
Sour Cream	1 cup
Whole Grain Mustard	1 Tbl.
Flour	1 Tbl.
Pepper	1/4 tsp.
Pie Shell	1 each

Pre-heat oven to 400 deg. Saute onions in butter until they are soft and clear, do not carmelize. Set aside to cool. Beat eggs, mustard & sr. cream together. Sprinkle flour on top & beat it in. Stir in pepper. If making a pie, prick bottom of shell. For tarts, pre-bake them. Spread onions evenly and pour sr. cream mixture over top. Pie—bake 15 min at 400, reduce heat to 350 for 15 min. more. Tarts—bake 10 min. or until nicely browned.
